Which Shore Excursions Are Right for You?

Choose the tours that interest you by using the icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the tours best suited to your physical capabilities. These icons will help you to interpret this brochure.



Easy Activity: Very light activity including short distances to walk; may include some steps.



Moderate Activity: Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.



Strenuous Activity: Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.



Panoramic Tours: Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these tours offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation from the vehicle during the tour. As vehicles outside the United States are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace is gentle and taking your time is encouraged.



Limited Capacity: The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or the need to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants in order to operate.

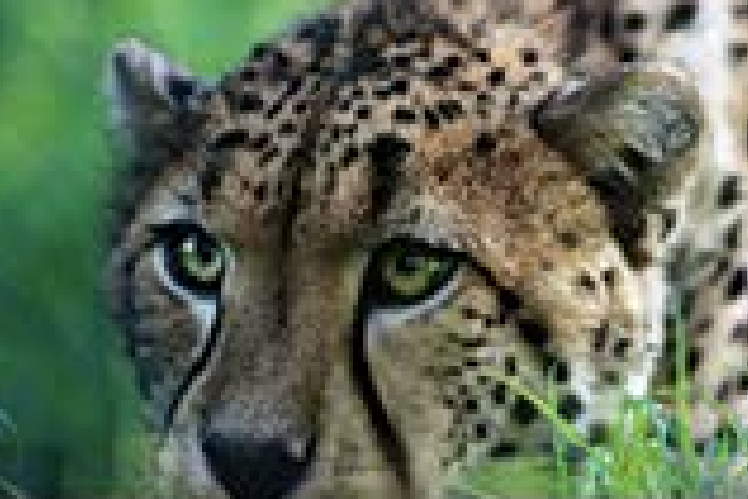


Snack: This tour includes a small snack or tasting of local specialties. The snack is not a meal.



Meal: This tour includes a meal—lunch on daytime tours, dinner on evening tours.





Guests Using A Mobility Aid Device or Wheelchair

I have a disability. How do I know which tours will best suit me?

The tours are graded according to the relative level of activity they entail. The activity icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please see page 1 for specific information or speak to a Shore Excursions specialist (1.888.425.9376). It is important to keep in mind that tour operators are subject to the laws of their own country with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States.

Will I encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship when it's in port?

Please see the on-board Shore Excursions staff to help determine whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. The decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain, made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety. We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

Frequently Asked Questions

What should I wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all shore excursions. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

What about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

How will I know what time each tour departs?

The on-board Shore Excursions Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your shore excursions tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at hollandamerica.com.

I am traveling with friends. Can we be accommodated on the same motorcoach?

The departure location for each tour is printed on

your shore excursions tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.

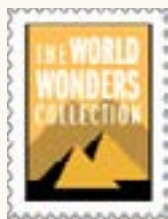

The cost includes the service of a English-speaking guide and/or driver, unlimited mileage, road tolls, parking fees and bottled water.

Not Included (Unless Otherwise Noted)

Guests' entrance fees for attractions are not included in the price due to the wide range of attraction possibilities, uncertain number of attractions to be visited, and varying number of guests participating. We strongly recommend that you bring some local currency to cover such costs as credit cards are not readily accepted in some ports. Lunch will not be included on any tour as many guests prefer to select their own dining venue.

Santa Barbara, California, US - Sunday, November 19, 2023:

A Ride Through History: Santa Barbara Historical Museum



Departs: Noon
Approximately 3 Hours

Hop in an open-air trolley for a unique perspective on early Santa Barbara with a Spanish-costumed guide. Travel past the most popular areas along Cabrillo Blvd, picturesque Chase Palm Park, Andree Clark Bird Refuge (home to 200 species of birds), and Montecito's shopping/dining area on Coast Village Road.

First, visit the **Santa Barbara Mission** for a photo stop. Note the magnificent architecture of the church façade and convent.

Continue to the **Santa Barbara Historical Museum** with special skip-the-line priority access. Located in the heart of Santa Barbara's historic El Pueblo Viejo District, the museum's stunning courtyards evoke the romance of early Spanish California. Tour the grounds with a docent explaining exhibits and displays including western art depicting cowboys and ranching, vaqueros and stagecoaches, Plains and Pueblo Indians, and California missions. "The Story of Santa Barbara" traces the development of Santa Barbara's history from the Chumash to Mexican rule, as a Spanish settlement to the movie-making era and the mid-20th century.

As you return to the ship by way of a panoramic drive, watch for some landmarks

of Santa Barbara -- the Court House, the Presidio and the historic Theatre District.

Notes:

Minimum age is 6 years. Wear comfortable walking shoes.

Island Whale Watching

For some of the best **whale-watching** opportunities in the world, look no further than the waters around the port city of Santa Barbara. Step aboard a state-of-the-art, high-speed **catamaran** for a full-day guided whale-watching expedition.

Watch from within the luxurious, teak-paneled cabin equipped with large, tinted windows -- perfect for optimal wildlife viewing. Or, take your place on a viewing platform on the bow or top deck, basking in the sun and sea breeze. Cruise among the breathtaking Channel Islands -- a small archipelago teeming with wildlife. Cormorants, gulls, pelicans, sea lions, harbor seals, and dolphins make their home here.

Time and weather permitting, you will step inside the **Painted Cave** to view its colorful pictographs. It is one of the largest and deepest sea caves in the world.

Keep a keen eye out for magnificent gray, blue, humpback and even orca whales. They are often seen spouting and breaching in the

glistening waters of this migratory corridor of the Pacific Ocean.

Notes:

Dress in layers; it can be cooler on the water. Wear reef-safe/biodegradable sunscreen, light clothing to act as a full cover-up for further protection from the sun, and a hat. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed.

Montecito Stars & History

This fabulous sightseeing tour makes it easy to soak up the razzle-dazzle of one of the wealthiest communities in America. Begin this star-studded half-day adventure by taking in some of the top attractions of **Santa Barbara** on a **panoramic drive**.

Watch for Stearns' Wharf -- Santa Barbara's most-visited attraction. It's the oldest working wharf in California. Locals enjoy the views of the Pacific Ocean and watching fishing boats offload their morning catch. A picturesque **drive** takes you down the coast, passing the estate of the late Huguette Clark -- daughter of a US congressman and oil tycoon.

Montecito has long been one of the favorite retreats of Hollywood stars, and now it's your turn to experience its glamorous lifestyle. Magnificent private estates, beautiful landscaping, luxury shopping and casual star sightings challenge the natural beauty of its shimmering coastline. Photograph the mega-

mansions of celebrities, such as Oprah Winfrey, Rob Lowe, Ellen DeGeneres, Drew Barrymore and Eric Schmidt.

Cruise down Coast Village Road, known as mini-Rodeo Drive, and past the famous Montecito Inn, built by Charlie Chaplin and Fatty Arbuckle. This starkly contrasts with Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, built in 1859.

You'll have an hour of **free time** to explore the upscale boutiques and cafés, often frequented by the celebrities who make their homes here. Keep your camera handy!

Santa Barbara & Los Olivos: California's Riviera, Food & Wine

A short transfer brings you into the town of **Santa Barbara**.

You will stop at the **Santa Barbara Courthouse** -- a Spanish/Moorish-style building heralded as one of the most beautiful government buildings in America.

Take photos at the Santa Barbara Mission, founded in 1786. It is known as the Queen of the Missions for its grand façade and more than 200 years of cultural history.

Travel further along the coast to the **Santa Ynez Valley** -- the area's wine-producing region. Nestled in the hills of Los Olivos, the Saarloos farm and vineyard is a family-owned

farming operation that makes its own wines. A "ground-to-glass" winery, it offers an exquisite collection of high-quality wines, each with a fascinating family history. With fewer than 400 cases in total, the vineyard produces some truly rare varietals in batches as small as 40 cases. Pairings are unexpectedly sweet, with specialty cupcakes from one of Santa Barbara's finest bakeries.

Transfer to **Corzaon Coina** -- beloved by locals -- for **lunch**. Chef Ramon Velsquez concocts inventive Mexican food inspired by cuisine from Guadalajara, Oaxaca and Baja. Focusing on seasonal ingredients, including farm-to-market vegetables and sustainable fish and meats, every dish is artfully prepared and tantalizingly tasty. Dine on street-style tacos and shared appetizers before returning to the pier.

Santa Barbara In Depth



Departs: 11:00 AM

Santa Barbara is a city best explored with a **genuine local resident** who knows all the ins and outs and who's who. Your guide today is just that person, having lived in Santa Barbara for 45 years, growing a passion for the interesting and entertaining details that visitors seldom see or hear.

Architectural and historical highlights will be pointed out all along the way. Learn how Spanish Revival architecture became popular when rebuilding took place after the 6.3 magnitude earthquake of 1925. The **Santa Barbara Mission** is a stunning example. Tour

the **gardens** and note the historical features of this beautiful building.

Step inside the **Santa Barbara Courthouse** to take in the views from the clocktower and to visit the **mural room**. Its four gorgeous murals were painted by Dan Sayre Groesbeck.

Walk through the downtown core to appreciate many historic sites; then, pause at a local brewery for **lunch** and a **beer tasting**. Empanadas are served here -- a delicious treat.

Notes:

Wear comfortable walking shoes. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair or for guests with mobility limitations. Strollers or other wheeled transportation cannot be accommodated.

Santa Barbara by Trolley

Acquaint yourself with **Santa Barbara** during this 1.5-hour fully narrated **panoramic drive**. From a nostalgic open-air trolley, take in views of Stearn's Wharf and its colorful shopping, dining and aquarium facilities.

Pause at the landmark Moreton Bay Fig Tree, whose canopy spans 160 feet, and travel up bustling State Street, lined with one-of-a-kind boutiques, restaurants and cafés.

Marvel at the palatial Spanish/Moorish revival Santa Barbara Courthouse -- reputedly the most beautiful government building in America. Nearby, the Spaniards built the white-washed adobe brick buildings of the Presidio military fortress to protect the mission and settlers. See the Lobero Theatre -- one of California's oldest performing arts buildings -- and the Santa Barbara Museum of Art.

Take photos at the majestic Santa Barbara Mission, known as the Queen of the Missions. Enjoy the beautifully restored Victorian houses of Brinkerhoff Avenue as you return to the ship.

Solvang On Your Own



Departs: 10:30 AM
Approximately 5¼ Hours
Adult \$69.95; Child \$54.95

This **transfer** may suit you if you would like to **explore on your own**. It consists of a motorcoach ride from the ship to **Solvang**. You will be dropped off at a central location, and the coach escort will advise you of the pick-up time for the return journey. You will have approximately four and a half hours to shop and explore independently.

Notes:

Guide service, taxi transfers, entrance fees and lunch are not included in the transfer price. It is your responsibility to be at the pick-up point at the given return time. An English-speaking escort will be aboard the transfer motorcoach to answer questions en route. Travel time to Solvang is approximately 45

minutes each way.

The Old Mission & A Ride through Santa Barbara History



Departs: Noon

Your Spanish-costumed guide for this insider tour comes from a family of civic leaders and is the recipient of a Community Hero Award. (S)he has in-depth knowledge of the local culture, history and events -- ideal for your ride through Santa Barbara history.

Board a **trolley ride** to learn about **Santa Barbara** and the American Riviera, where the local architecture hails from, and which hotspots are included in the Funk Zone.

You will visit the **Old Mission** with special skip-the-line priority access. Tour the interior and grounds with a knowledgeable Mission docent. Note the magnificent architecture of the church façade and convent, and step inside to take in the breathtaking church interior. Colonial-era art and sculptures are on display. This is the only California mission church with a crypt under the sanctuary.

The on-site **Museum of Art & Artifacts** features historical artwork and artifacts, lush gardens, and an acclaimed exhibit of the *Lone Woman of San Nicolas Island*. Your special visit includes the Della Robbia glazed terracotta tableau and the *Madonna & Saints* shrine. On the grounds, check out the cemetery and mausoleum.

As you return to the ship by way of a

panoramic drive, watch for some landmarks of Santa Barbara -- the Courthouse, the Presidio, and the historic Theatre District.

Notes:

Minimum age is 6 years. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair or for guests with mobility limitations. Strollers or other wheeled transport are not allowed inside the museum.

Monterey, California, US - Tuesday, November 21, 2023:

17-Mile Drive & Carmel



Departs: 8:30 AM
Approximately 4¼ Hours
Adult \$99.95; Child \$69.95

Travel the famed **17-Mile Drive** -- one of America's most picturesque roads -- which winds along the rocky coastline. This bucket-list drive includes a stop at Bird Rock and Seal Rock for wildlife viewing and a chance for a photograph at the world-famous Pebble Beach Golf Club.

Monterey's natural rocky coastline, unobstructed views of the Pacific, the wildlife of the peninsula, and the famed Monterey cypress trees complete a pretty picture.

Explore **Carmel-by-the-Sea** -- an idyllic European-style village with local art galleries, unique restaurants and quaint architecture. Carmel offers everything from fairytale cottages brimming with antiques to designer boutiques, trendy art galleries and *al fresco* restaurants along its picturesque Ocean Avenue. Lose yourself in the hidden pathways and secret gardens that lie between the small city blocks, and enjoy the sleepy ambience of a beautiful village that has retained its small-town feel despite its world renown.

At **Bird Rock**, one of the most famous stops along 17-Mile Drive, it's often hard to see the rock itself, as there are so many avian occupants clamoring for space. Breathe in the magnificent coastal views and the abundant wildlife as pelicans and cormorants jockey for space. You may hear seals and sea lions barking in the distance, and sea otters peek

their heads above water as they nestle in the floating kelp forests.

Your guide will point out the Lone Cypress, which sits on a prominent rocky outcrop framed by the Pacific Ocean.

Catch a view of one of the most stunning golf courses in America -- Pebble Beach has a tale for each storied hole. Since 1919, the biggest names in golf have teed up on its emerald links, and over the years it has been the site of many prestigious tournaments. Designed by Jack Neville and Douglas Grant, the course hugs California's rugged coastline, providing wide-open vistas, cliff-side fairways and sloping greens.

Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary Whale Watching



Departs: 9:00 AM
Approximately 4¼ Hours
Adult \$74.95; Child \$64.95

Monterey Bay is the premier destination for whale-watching all year 'round. This trip, **narrated by a marine biologist or naturalist**, provides educational and interesting information about **whales, dolphins**, and a wide variety of marine wildlife.

Head out onto the ocean, where marine biologists collect sighting data for scientific research. You may travel to different locations within the **Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary** to view whales and dolphins. The crew offers tips on how to capture photos and videos of the wildlife.

A professional photographer also captures those amazing moments with the wildlife, so you don't have to worry about getting the perfect shot.

Beer, wine and snacks are available for purchase on the vessel (at your own expense).

Notes:

Dress warmly in layers with a windproof outer layer. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed.

Monterey: The Movie Magnet

See the scenic beauty and the rich history of the Monterey Peninsula through the eyes of Hollywood. This award-winning tour highlights the breathtaking scenery of the area. Your experience takes place in a multi-media **"Theater on Wheels" customized motorcoach** with high-back seats and personal headsets. Scenes of blockbuster movies with such stars as Clint Eastwood, Doris Day, and Elizabeth Taylor show on overhead monitors at the exact location where they were filmed.

Your journey is enhanced by a live narration of the area's history, beauty, and movie-making magic.

You'll travel along 17-Mile Drive in Pebble

Beach and wind through Monterey, Cannery Row, Pacific Grove and Carmel, with three spectacular photo opportunity stops along the way.

You'll also stop for **shopping** at the legendary **Lodge at Pebble Beach**, where the world-renowned Pebble Beach Golf Course is located.

Redwood & Vineyards



Departs: 8:30 AM
Approximately 6½ Hours
Adult \$139.95; Child \$89.95

Travel along the stunning **central California coast** with its beautiful vistas. Kick back and enjoy the views of the central coast with its jagged cliffs, beautiful waters and rolling waves with the occasional marine mammals poking their heads above water. This is one of the least-developed stretches of coastline on the west coast, and its beauty has inspired artists, poets, musicians and writers for decades.

After crossing the famous **Bixby Creek Bridge**, you'll arrive at **Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park** for a chance to walk among the **coastal redwood trees**. Visitors marvel at these red-barked giants, which can grow beyond 300 feet tall. The central and northern California coastline, along with a few areas in Oregon, are the only places in the world where these trees can be seen growing in their natural habitat. Next, head to the **Carmel Valley**. The **grape-growing regions** of Monterey and Carmel are part of the Central Coast Viticultural Area, and are beginning to rival the famous Napa

Valley to the north in terms of wine quality and production. You'll travel through beautiful rolling hills and thriving vineyards to visit a **local winery** to taste their wines.

Enjoy some **free time** to explore the small **village of Carmel Valley** and to find a charming local restaurant or café for lunch (at your own expense). For the true wine buffs, there are several more wineries within the village to visit and enjoy.

San Francisco, California, US - Wednesday, November 22, 2023: With cable cars that "climb halfway to the stars," this is everybody's favorite city by the bay. However, we do our utmost to find the very best packages for your touring pleasure. Guests who leave during a tour for which transportation is included must thereafter provide for their

own transportation and services at their own expense. Transportation standards vary from country to country.

Self-Guided Touring

Guests who do not join these prearranged shore excursions must rely on whatever transportation is available in each port. If you choose to devise your own excursion, we suggest that you remind the driver or tour escort of the ship's sailing time. Of course, the ship's facilities are fully available to guests while in port.

Reservations & Online Reservations

Now you can easily choose your tour times, book your tours and receive confirmation of your shore excursions reservations 24 hours a day. Visit us online at hollandamerica.com or phone us at 1-888-425-9376. Book online now, up until 3 days before sailing. Make your payment online via our secure website, and receive confirmation as well as your tour departure times. You can also download the shore excursions, view tour prices, find answers to frequently asked questions and read general information. Remember, online and phone shore excursion reservations are processed prior to any requests made on board the ship and receive priority handling. At

the time of making your reservations online, we will advise you whether or not your reservations are confirmed or whether you have been waitlisted. Your credit card will be charged immediately for all confirmed reservations. Should space become available for a waitlisted tours request, we will e-mail or otherwise contact you at that time and either immediately charge your credit card if you have already given us your credit card information or ask you to provide us with that information for immediate charge processing. Reservations for shore excursions are subject to cancellation by us at any time prior to the credit card charge being accepted by your bank. If you or Holland America cancel a tour (except Overland Adventures and Overnights) more than 3 days prior to cruise departure, we will issue a credit on the credit card that you used to pay for the reservation. For any cancellation within 3 days of departure, a credit will not be given on your credit card. Instead, we will apply an ONBOARD CREDIT ONLY policy under which the refund (less any cancellation fee) will show up as a credit to the shipboard account of the person who was to take the tour. If the credit is not fully utilized during the cruise, the balance will be paid to that guest by the ship's Purser. Once on board, if you cancel your tour reservation after the booking deadline stated in the Shore Excursion Planning Form on board, a 100% cancellation fee will apply since transportation and services will have already been arranged. If space on the tour you have ordered is not available

you will be contacted to see if you are interested in another tour selection. You may receive confirmation of your tours via e-mail. Vouchers for each confirmed tour will be delivered to your stateroom after embarkation.

Immunizations

It is the guests' responsibility to remain apprised of changes in immunization policies, so that they have all the required inoculations and immunizations at the time of departure.

Safety

We take steps to identify and contract with reputable tour operators. Tour operators must comply with local government requirements and carry liability insurance in amounts consistent with local standards to address personal injury and property damage.

Visa Requirements

Each guest is responsible for obtaining all visas needed to join the cruise. Unless otherwise noted, it is the guest's sole responsibility to obtain any necessary visas to participate in any Overland Adventures and Overnights. Guests must keep themselves apprised of policy changes. Passports, visas (other than as specified above), tourist cards, and vaccinations, if required, are the sole responsibility of the guest. Cancellation of Signature Collection Arrangements

There is no penalty for canceling most pre-booked tours; however, if you cancel a Signature Collection private vehicle tour, a 100% cancellation fee will apply since transportation and services will have already been arranged.

Cancellation of Overland Adventures and Overnights

The cancellation policy for Overland Adventures and Overnights is (unless noted otherwise in the tour description):

- 30 - 60 days before tour date: 25%
- 14 - 29 days before tour date: 50%
- Within 14 days: Non-Refundable

Please note that the Cancellation Protection Plan covers pre-booked tours, including Overland Adventures and Overnights, if cancellation is made up to 24 hours prior to commencement of cruise. Tours cancelled within 24 hours prior to commencement of cruising or while on board are not covered by the Cancellation Protection Plan and are subject to the above penalties.
